

SECTORAL GUIDANCE STATUS – DASHBOARD

- This table refers to the development of sector specific guidance.
- Our Framework for Decision Making (published 23 April) sets out our approach and the principles that will guide us out of the current lockdown arrangements.
- This makes clear that the timing of any restart will be decided on the **basis of the public health evidence**. We are listening to the best scientific advice on if, when, and how to ease restrictions to inform our decisions and seeking to balance the inter-related personal, social, and economic harms.
- We are working with business, employers, trades unions, regulatory bodies and others in establishing a collective approach to restarting the economy in a safe and orderly way. **The sector specific guidance is one part of this process.**

Energy	Safety On guidance for onshore renewables published – this is industry’s own guidance. Will now liaise with G Plus to develop off shore guidance and will share with STUC and UNITE. SG policy officials considering other energy sectors 22/5 Oil & Gas –Draft Guidance by industry to be shared with SG & STUC by 1 June, seeking to clear through the internal clearance process by mid-June.
Agriculture	Consulting with stakeholder regarding sub-sector guidance. Livestock 21/5 – HPS have provided feedback to NAAC guidance (already published). Plans to release general guidance for farmers and crofters next week.
Forestry	27/5 – Due to be published today or tomorrow.
Finance	28/5 Working group set up to inform development of sector guidance. Invitation to shortly be sent to Unite colleagues to join group
Food & Drink	28/5 – Updated FSS risk assessment and associated guidance published today

Technology	22/5 Digital Data SG Contact made with industry trade body & TUs to discuss & agree approach. Majority of workers are working from home.
Tourism	27/5 Aim to prepare core SG guidance for tourism and hospitality for publication by 18 June. This will link to more detailed industry-led guidance for subsectors.
Telecoms operations	Meeting being arranged with operators and TUs to discuss links with construction and road works guidance
Creative Industries	28/5 Working group met and discussed draft guidance with a view to publish by 12 June. No substantial redraft is required and intention is to begin clearance process shortly. SAU, Equity, BECTU/Prospect have contributed to guidance.
SME Enterprises	27/5 SG guidance being developed to cover all sectors. Engaging with stakeholders.
